










Language and approach: shared way of talking about and planning all aspects of digital - a common language

Are you **managing** how digital is resourced? ... Have you considered both the upfront and ongoing costs of managing and maintaining your digital technologies, systems and tools as well as the digital skills development of your workforce and volunteers?
